Day 1: Kuching - Batang Ai Resort

This exciting day starts with a pleasant drive to Semenggoh Orangutan Centre. Walk through the scenic forest reserve to the feeding platform and see the orang utans swaying from the treetop canopy as they come down for the feeding. This is a rare opportunity to get in close contact with the orang utan. Continue on 4 hours drive through the wonderful Sarawak country side passing through scenic greenery of rainforest and fields of pepper and rubber.

We will stop at Serian town to visit an excellent farmers market. Proceed to Lachau town for lunch at a local Chinese restaurant. Drive to Batang Ai Hydro Dam and transfer by motorized boat for 20 minutes ride across the Batang Ai Lake to Hilton Batang Ai Longhouse resort. We spend two nights here with the comfort of 5 stars Hilton Resort and dinner in the resort restaurant. (L/D)

Day 2: Batang Ai Longhouse

After breakfast, we embark on a native longboat for a day of exploring the Ulu Ai River and its Iban longhouse communities. Depart by longboat for an hour drive to Nanga Ukum Longhouse. On arrival take part in the welcoming ceremony of warrior dance, music and gongs by the local folks. Try your hands on the blow pipe, taste local brew rice wine 'Tuak'. Later we adjourn to a bamboo cooked picnic lunch with BBQ fish by the river bank. After lunch, we return by boat to our resort for dinner and overnight. (B/L/D)

Day 3: Batang Ai Resort - Kuching

After breakfast, transfer by boat to Batang Ai terminal for our return journey to Kuching. Lunch will be provided en-route at a local restaurant. Arrive Kuching in the late afternoon. **(B/L)**

Please bring along comfortable light clothing, a sun hat, poncho, battery torch light, swim suit, some insect repellent and drinking water bottle.

Day 1: Kota Kinabalu - Kinabalu Park (L/D)

Drive 88 km to Kinabalu Park, Malaysia 's first World Heritage Site. Bird watching in Kinabalu Park , home to over 300 species of birds. Overnight in Kundasang.

Day 2-4: Kinabalu Park – Poring (B/L/D)

Full day bird watching in Kinabalu Park. Birdwatching in Poring on one of these days.

Day 5: Poring - Sepilok (B/L/D)

Morning Bird watching before departing to Sepilok in approximately 4-hour overland journey to the east coast. Night walk in the evening. Overnight at Sepilok.

Day 6: Rainforest Discovery Centre (B/L/D)

Full day birdwatching in Rainforest Discovery Centre. Overnight at Sepilok.

Day 7: Sepilok - Sukau (B/L/D)

Birdwatching in the morning. At noon , depart to Sukau by boat on Sabah 's longest river, the Kinabatangan. Lower Kinabatangan is home to 210 species of birds. Check into the award winning Sukau Rainforest Lodge, named by National Geographic Adventure magazine in 2009 as one of the top 50 jungle lodges in the world. Join an afternoon cruise for bird watching.

Day 8-9: Sukau (B/L/D)

Morning and afternoon cruise for bird watching. Visit Gomantong Caves on one of these evenings to watch the exodus of bats and bathawks.

Day 10: Sukau - Tabin (B/L/D)

Proceed to Lahad Datu and then onwards to Tabin Wildlife Reserve, another haven for bird watching enthusiasts which boasts approximately 220 species of birds.

Day 11: Tabin (B/L/D)

Full day bird watching in Tabin.

Day 12: Tabin – Borneo Rainforest Lodge (B/L/D)

Transfer to Lahad Datu and Danum Valley. Check into Borneo Rainforest Lodge before continuing bird watching. More than 300 species of birds have been recorded in Danum Valley.



Crocker Range Jungle Trek

This trekking tour requires a considerably good level of physical fitness due to the varying terrain that you may encounter. A journey through the back spine of Sabah, and the highest mountain range in Malaysia, this awe-inspiring trekking tour takes you through quaint local villages, cooling forest rivers, paddy fields and first class forest reserves which has one of the richest bio-diversities on this planet. Your accommodation would be simple rustic village houses and your meals are prepared by the guide. A truly memorable trek that comes highly recommended.

Crocker Range National Park in Brief

The Crocker Range is a forest covered mountain range which stretches in a south westerly direction from Mount Kinabalu towards the Sabah - Sarawak border. It separates the coastal plains from the interior regions. Frequently shrouded in rain clouds, the peak rise to between 1200 - 1800 meters above sea and coastal plains. Formerly a forest reserve, its 1399 square kilometers became a national park in 1984. It is the largest park in Sabah.

The Crocker Range is bisected by the Padas Gorge, through which swirls the mighty Padas River. The Crocker Range provides a vital water catchment area for communities in the foothills and plains to both the west coast and interior.

Previously, there was no road from the interior to the coastal town but only with bridle paths crisscrossing the hinterlands. These bridle paths took the villagers down to the coastal town, bartering for salt, matches and kerosene. These paths have since been known as Salt Trail. Viewing wildlife is not the highlight in this tour.

Day 1:

Depart your hotel for 1 hour drive to Km 50 Tambunan Road. Upon arrival, commence trekking at 5,000 ft above sea level, walking downhill on a 45° slope, passing through native villages, primary/secondary jungle and shifting cultivation (5 hours). Overnight at village house. **(L/D)**

Day 2:

Trekking on gentle terrain and ridges, crisscrossing river beds, native villages, jungle and paddy fields. Overnight at village house by river bank. **(B/L/D)**

Day 3:

Wake up to the call of roosters in the morning before continuing our trek along river beds and jungle. Take a dip into the cool refreshing river of Crocker Range and enjoy a picnic lunch by the river bank. Return to village house for overnight. **(B/L/D)**

Day 4:

After breakfast, continue your last day of jungle trekking (5 hours) passing through a mixture of paddy fields and secondary forest. Give each other high five for having beaten one of the toughest treks in Borneo. **(B/L)**



In the evening a traditional style dinner sitting on the mat, will be served, followed by a night of traditional ceremonial dances and merry making. Overnight in the longhouse. (L/D)

The highlight of a trip to Borneo is a stay overnight in an Iban longhouse. You will be treated to the most memorable experience of the extremely hospitable and friendly Ibans who treasure the unique traditional lifestyle living under one roof and reserving their rich culture and traditions.

Day 2

After breakfast, witness and participate in the blow pipe demonstration, a guided nature walk which give you an opportunity to learn about some medicinal plants, edible fruits and leaves, the agricultural activities of the community and some game traps used in the past for trapping animals. We will stop by the river beach for a backwoods style picnic lunch where our foods are cooked in bamboo. At Kinabalu Park World Heritage Site, visit the Education Centre and Mountain Garden, home to various species of the flowering Rhododendrons, carnivorous pitcher plants, orchids, ferns, oak trees and birds. Night temperature at the park is around 14 - 25° C. If time and weather permits, take a guided walk on one of the trails in the cool surrounding to observe the montane forest. Overnight in Kundasang. (L/D)

Day 2:

After breakfast, continue 40 km overland journey to Poring, 1,500 ft above sea level, east of Kinabalu Park HQ. Explore tropical lowland rainforest and the jungle trail leading up to the treetop canopy walkways, suspended 41 meters above the forest floor across giant mengaris trees (excludes camera/video fee). Visit Kipungit Waterfall and soak in hot sulphur pools. Proceed to Kundasang Memorial Park to learn part of Sabah's WWII history. Return to Kota Kinabalu. (B/L)

Day 1 (Sunday): Kuala Lumpur / Cameron Highlands

Heading North into the state of Perak, your journey to Cameron Highlands (the centre of Malaysia tea production) takes you to an altitude of 1500-1800 metres above sea level. Vegetables grow in profusion and flowers bloom, everywhere in the cool weather, which can drop to 12 degrees Celsius. Day 2 (Monday): Cameron Highlands / Penang

Your day begins with a pleasant drive downhill and northwards to Ipoh - the city of millionaires', which made its fortune from the rich tin mines of Kinta Valley - the heart of tin dredging in Malaysia. Enroute, you will visit Kellies Castle built by the Scottish rubber tycoon and famous Cave Temples in Ipoh, followed by lunch at a local restaurant. Travel North to Kuala Kangsar, with its unique Ubudiah Mosque - a magnificent building with golden dome - and the Palace of the Sultan of Perak towards the state of Penang. You will cross the Penang Bridge (spanning 13.5km - the longest bridge in Asia and third in the world) into the island of Penang. Check into your hotel located on the beach.

Day 3 (Tuesday): Penang

Today you explore Penang - The "Pearl of the Orient" and the oldest British settlement in Malaysia. Your exploration will take you to the famous Penang Snake Temple. If you fancy it, have your photograph taken with a venomous Wagler's Pit viper draped over you! Continue to explore the various attractions in Georgetown including the Khoo Kongsi "Dragon Mountain Hall" clan house with its ancient design constructed to capture the splendor of an Imperial Palace. More attractions include the historical Fort Cornwallis and the Thai Temple of Wat Chayamangkalaram, which houses a 33-metre reclining Buddha. Today you explore Penang - The "Pearl of the Orient" and the oldest British settlement in Malaysia. Your exploration will take you to the famous Penang Snake Temple. If you fancy it, have your photograph taken with a venomous Wagler's Pit viper draped over you! Continue to explore the various attractions in Georgetown including the Khoo Kongsi "Dragon Mountain Hall" clan house with its ancient design constructed to capture the splendor of an Imperial Palace. More attractions include the historical Fort Cornwallis and the Thai Temple of Wat Chayamangkalaram, which houses a 33-metre reclining Buddha. The rest of the afternoon is left for you to enjoy the sparkling white beaches.

Day 4 (Wednesday): Penang / Pangkor Island

Enjoy a scenic drive past quaint towns and belts of rice fields. Enroute stop at Taiping, once the capital of Perak and a thriving mining town, its disused mining pools has been turned into the famous Taiping Lake Gardens. Boasting 62 hectares of park, its lovely lakes and lush greenery with huge ancient rain trees with drooping branches are an unforgettable sight. Day 1 (Saturday): KUALA LUMPUR - CAMERON HIGHLANDS (220 KM)

Depart by 0830 hours for Cameron Highland located at 1542 meters above sea level and noted for its tea plantations and cool temperatures. Stop on the way for a visit to see the cottage industry of basket weaving at work followed by Lata Iskandar Waterfall and a native settlement. Be immersed in the cool, crisp air of Cameron Highlands with its wonderful scenery. Tour of Cameron Highlands consists of the tea plantation, tea factory, market place and butterfly farm. Overnight Strawberry Park Hotel.

Day 2 (Sunday): CAMERON HIGHLANDS - PENANG (330 KM)

Early morning set off to Penang. Enroute visit the Sam Poh Tong cave temple. Thereafter stop at the Royal town of Kuala Kangsar for a spell of photographing of the exterior view only of Ubudiah Mosque, Iskandariah Palace and Istana Kenangan. Cross over to Penang, better known as the "Pearl of the Orient" via one of the longest bridge in the world. Overnight Bayview Beach Resort

Day 3 (Monday): DISCOVERY TOUR OF GEORGETOWN PENANG

0900 hrs, depart from hotel for a City, Culture, and Heritage tour of Georgetown, which has been official declared as a UNESCO SITE in 2008. Visit the 3rd longest reclining Buddha figure in the world followed by the Kek Lok Si Temple that was built in 1904. It is the most beautiful and largest Buddhist temple complex in South East Asia and is known as the Temple of the 1000 Buddhas – that was built in 1904. It is the most beautiful and largest Buddhist temple complex in SouthEast Asia. Next on the agenda is Fort Cornwallis, the landing site of Captain Francis Light in 1786 when he arrived to start the first British colony in Penang. Tour carries on with a visit to the water village of The Clan Jetties at Weld Quay so named as residents of each jetty share similar surname.

Continue to the other part of the Old Georgetown. Drive along Pitt Street, also known as "The Street of Harmony". Here churches, Chinese temples, mosques and Hindu temples are built along the same street in harmonious existence side by side for centuries. Visit the intricate Khoo Kong Si clan's house. Enjoy a breezy trishaw ride, a still popular mode of transport in eorgetown. Return to the hotel and the rest of the day is at your own leisure. In the late evening, you can explore the nightlife along Batu Ferringhi, Penang style! Overnight.

Day 4 (Tuesday): PENANG - KOTA BAHRU (400 KM)

Depart at 0830 hours, traveling west to east overland across Peninsular Malaysia through the main mountain range, which offers breathtaking views of the dense tropical rain forest whilst journeying through villages and plantations. Later on route, we will make a photo stop on Banding Island with its scenic view of the famous Temenggor lake, good spot for a lunch break (not inclusive in tour price) or for simply walking around taking in the scenery of the calm picturesque lake surrounded by the grand and immense tropical rainforest in the background. Further on, stop at the highest mountain point on this route, 1050meters above sea level overlooking the Thailand and Malaysian border. Overnight Swiss Garden Resort

Day 7 (Friday): KUANTAN - KUCHING (B)

Transfer to the airport for your flight to Kuching. Arrival transfer to the hotel

Day 8 (Saturday): KUCHING City Tour (B)

This city tour will take visitors past the main attractions such as the Chinatown, Cat monument, City Tower for a bird's eye view of Kuching city, the Malay Houses on stilts, Old State Mosque, Main Bazaar, India Street, Gambier Road, Wet Market, Colonial Centre, Textile Museum, Chinese Museum, Sarawak Museum, Kuching Waterfront to view the ultramodern State Legislative Assembly building, alongside the historical Astana and Fort Margherita.

Day 9 (Sunday): Lemanak Longhouse (B/L/D)

We depart from Kuching for a 4 hours drive through the scenic greenery of rainforest, fields of pepper and rubber. Visit the local market at Serian . Drive to the Lemanak River where a traditional longboat takes you upriver under the rainforest canopy to the longhouse. Pay a courtesy visit to the headman of the longhouse. Explore the surrounding forest and visit pepper garden. In the evening a traditional style dinner sitting on floormat will be served followed by a night of ceremonial dances and merry making. Overnight in the longhouse.

Day 10 (Monday): Lemanak Longhouse - KUCHING (B/L)

After breakfast, participate in the blow pipe demonstration followed by a guided nature walk with opportunity to learn about some medicinal plants, edible fruits and leaves, the agricultural activities of the community and some game traps used in the past for trapping animals. We will stop along riverbank for a backwoods style picnic lunch with our foods cooked in bamboo. After lunch, depart by longboat down river and continue overland for your return journey to Kuching. Arrive Kuching in the late afternoon. Overnight at hotel.

Day 11 (Tuesday): KUCHING - MIRI - MULU (B/L/D)

Transfer to airport for flight to Mulu with a short transit in Miri. Meet at Mulu Airport and transfer to resort (or Park Chalet) for checkin. After lunch, trek 45 minutes on raised plankwalk through lowland rainforest and peat swamp to Skywalk Canopy and Lang Caves . Walk inside the largest cave passage of Deer Caves . Witness the daily exodus of millions of bats at the Observatory at sunset before we return. Overnight at hotel or chalet.

Day 12 (Wednesday): MULU Wind and Clearwater Caves (B/L/D)

We take a 45 minutes ride by longboat up Melinau River to explore Wind Caves. Visit Clearwater caves to see the subterranean river passage which at 100 km, is the longest cave system in South East Asia. Lunch at nearby Clearwater River and swim in the crystal clear water before we return.



Day 13 (Thursday): MULU - MIRI - BRUNEI (BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN) (B)

Fly back to Miri and then transfer overland to Brunei . Overnight at Bandar Seri Begawan .

Day 14 (Friday): BRUNEI City Tour (B)

This 4- hours tour of Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei 's Capital unfolds part of Brunei 's history, heritage, religion, culture and daily living of the local people. Tour includes a photo stop outside the Royal Palace, Istana Nurul Iman "Palace of Light", which is the biggest residential palace in the world. Also visit the most magnificently built, "The Jame 'Asr Hassanil Bolkiah Mosque" before we take a boat ride through the famous Water Village with a chance to stop of and walk around. Then, we move on to the Brunei Museum, and learn about the birth of Brunei, and see the Borneo ethnographic display, natural history collection, treasures of ceramic, glassware and carpets before heading back to your hotel.

Day 15 (Saturday): BRUNEI - KOTA KINABALU Night Market (B/D)

Transfer to airport for a 25 minutes morning flight from Brunei to Kota Kinabalu and transfer to hotel. We will pick you up from your hotel in the afternoon for a brief sunset tour covering Signal Hill overlooking the city centre and the offshore islands and Tanjung Aru beach. Transfer to Kinabalu Park . Visit the Education Centre and Mountain Garden and then to Poring Hot Springs for treetop canopy walk. Return to Kota Kinabalu. Overnight at hotel

Day 17 (Monday): KOTA KINABALU – SANDAKAN Sepilok Orang Utan Rehabilitation Centre – SUKAU (B/L/D)

Morning flight MH2042 to Sandakan before 0800 hours. On arrival at Sandakan Airport, transfer to Sepilok Orang Utan Rehabilitation Centre. Walk ten minutes through the rainforest on wooden boardwalks to witness the feeding of the orang utans at 1000hrs. Watch short video show of the rehabilitation process.

After lunch, transfer to Sandakan jetty for 2.5 hours boat journey to the multi awards winning Sukau Rainforest Lodge along Sabah's longest river, Kinabatangan with opportunity to view birds and wildlife in virgin mangrove, wetland and rainforest habitats. After checkin and afternoon refreshment, we take a river cruise using electric motor in search of some of the 10 primate species. Sukau is home to Borneo pygmy elephants, orang utans, proboscis monkeys and all eight species of hornbill in Borneo.

Return for solar heated hot shower, candle light dinner overlooking the riverbank followed by slide show and interpretation by naturalist guide. Overnight at the newly renovated 20 rooms Sukau Rainforest Lodge, named by National Geographic Adventure magazine in 2009 as one of the top 50 jungle lodges in the world.

Day 18 (Tuesday): SUKAU (B/L/D)

Wake up to the calls of gibbons and hornbills and hot Sabah tea. A 0600hrs morning river cruise up the Kinabatangan River to Kelenanap oxbow lake to view more birds and wildlife. After breakfast, proceed for an educational tour on the our own in-house Hornbill Boardwalk located behind the lodge with our in-house naturalist. In the afternoon, we proceed for another river cruise for more wildlife. Overnight at Sukau Rainforest Lodge.

Day 19 (Wednesday): SUKAU - SANDAKAN (B/L)

Maliau Basin in Brief

Located at the south-central region of Sabah, approximately 40km off the Kalimantan border is Maliau Basin, Sabah's Lost World. With an area of 590 sq km, Malian Basin was part of Yayasan Sabah Concession Area and voluntarily designated as a Conservation Area in 1981 for research, education, and training purposes. It was upgraded in 1997 to a Class I Protection Forest Reserve and extended to present size. Its protection was further enhanced when it was gazetted as a Cultural Heritage Site under the state Cultural Heritage (Conservation) Enactment in 1999. Day-to-day management is by Yayasan Sabah on behalf of Maliau Basin Management Committee. The Rivers of Maliau Basin flows out into the Kuamut River, a major tributary of the Kinabatangan. The main forests are Lower montane, Heath, Lowland and hill Dipterocarp forest. Over 1800 species types of plants have been identified, including 6 species of pitcher plants and 80 species of orchids. Over 82 mammal species, 270 bird species and over 30 species of amphibians have so far been recorded.

Sukau Rainforest Lodge

The 20 rooms, multi international award winners, was built in 1995 in traditional Malaysian architecture using several Borneo hardwood species. It is built on stilts with a lounge, gift shop, education centre, Hornbill Boardwalk with two elephant passes, three open deck for wildlife viewing, an enclosed garden, a riverside Melapi restaurant, open sun-deck, river jetty. Electricity is supplied by acoustic generator, and hot water by solar heaters. All rooms are twin bedded, with ceiling fan, mosquito netting, attached bathroom, hot shower and toilets. River tours are conducted by boats powered by electric motors and four stoke outboard engines.

Birdlife is especially rich here including eight species of hornbills, kingfishers, egrets, darters, owls, kites, eagles, broadbills, doves, storm storks, herons, hawks, ospreys, falcon, pheasants, parakeets, bee eaters, woodpeckers, pittas, bulbuls, forktails, babblers, warblers, flycatchers, orioles, flowerpeckers, spiderhunters, among others.

Arrive Kuching and check into hotel. Free at leisure

Day 2: City Tour (B)
